LifeBridge Northwest Hospital Earns Top Honor for Advancing Patient Safety

The Maryland Patient Safety Center (MPSC) has named **LifeBridge Northwest Hospital** the winner of the 2025 Minogue Award for Patient Safety Innovation for their project, "Gearing Up for Greatness—Using Continuous Improvement and HRO Principles to Create a High-Performing Nursing Unit."

Greater Baltimore Medical Center received the **Distinguished Achievement Award** for their impactful patient safety initiative, "Using Greater Baltimore Medical Center's Leadership System to Create a Nurse-Led Initiative to Support a Safe Reduction in NTSV C-Section Deliveries."

"Winning the Minogue Award for 'Gearing Up for Greatness' reflects our unwavering commitment to the patient, our team, and our journey to become a high-reliability organization with zero patient harm.
