



**Maryland Patient Safety Center Announces
Patient Safety Innovation Awards Winners for 2022**

***Adventist Healthcare and Johns Hopkins Home Care Group and Johns Hopkins Hospital
Take Home the Top Honors***

Elkridge, MD – January 5, 2022 - The Maryland Patient Safety Center recently announced that Adventist Healthcare has been named the recipient of the 2022 Minogue Award for Patient Safety Innovation. The winning project was titled “Improving Patient Experience and Shared Decision-Making with Interdisciplinary Bedside Rounding.” Johns Hopkins Home Care Group and Johns Hopkins Hospital were named the winners of the Distinguished Achievement for Patient Safety Innovation Award for their program titled “Utilizing Transition Guide Nurses to Facilitate Safe Transition of Patients from Hospitals to Community Settings and to Reduce Hospital Readmission Rates.”

Eight other hospitals were named Circle of Honor winners, an award recognizing other top solutions in healthcare.

The winners were selected by a panel of independent judges who are leaders in the Maryland healthcare community. As in years past, the top two award winners will present their winning solutions at the 18th Annual Maryland Patient Safety Conference, being held on March 4, 2022. All winners, including the Circle of Honor for Patient Safety Innovation recipients, will be recognized and given the opportunity to present their project posters.

“Selecting honorees for the Minogue awards is never easy as the healthcare organizations in Maryland continue to be leaders on a national level in their commitment to patient safety and the spirit of innovation,” said Blair M.Eig, MD President & CEO of the Maryland Patient Safety Center. “All of our participants are committed to addressing the issues facing patient safety and we are proud to be able to honor them for their accomplishments that have a transformative impact on the delivery and quality of care in Maryland and beyond.”

Named for the Center’s first President and Executive Director, William Minogue, MD, FACP, to honor his enduring contributions to and passion for improving patient care and safety, The Minogue Award was created by the Center Board of Directors to recognize an organization
