### **Program Overview:**

This inaugural course, developed by the MedStar Health Institute for Quality and Safety, for the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ), is being offered in person at the Maryland Patient Safety Center (MPSC). The course is intended to raise diagnostic safety awareness, introduce the concept of a broad multidisciplinary diagnostic team that includes non-clinicians and patients and their families, and provide assessment and training tools to support efforts to reduce diagnostic harm. The course consists of customizable modules that can be utilized to meet the needs of your team and course facilitator.

#### **Objectives:**

- Define diagnostic error and its importance as a patient safety issue
- Explain the impact of provider communication breakdowns on diagnostic error.
- Describe TeamSTEPPS® and how it can be an important and appropriate intervention to reduce diagnostic error.
- Utilize the materials presented in the course to support your department and organizational efforts to reduce diagnostic harm.
