Program Overview:

Coaching is an effective way to influence and improve team performance. The effective use of coaching can achieve several positive outcomes including positively impacting leadership development and workplace culture. Effective coaches play a critical role in the success of a team through modeling the desired behaviors; observing and providing feedback to staff using the those behaviors; providing opportunities to practice what has been learned and exhibited; and facilitating sustained motivation for the behavior changes. Because coaches work directly with staff in day-today situations, they can help identify and remove barriers to the adoption of desired team behaviors. This webinar will provide participants with strategies and tools to be an effective coach to improve team performance.
